PDG and School Essentials grants available for families

Don't forget to apply for Free School Meals if you can – even if your child already gets a free school meal as part of universal provision. In addition to the free meals, being registered also gives your child access to further support at school (through our PDG) and financial assistance at home (through School Essentials).

School Essentials provides financial assistance of up to £125 per child for the purchase of items such as school uniform, shoes, waterproofs, sports kit, equipment (bags, stationery), IT equipment (laptops, tablets).

Members of the Governing Body reflect the diversity of the local community. The chair is elected at the beginning of every academic year. The Governing Body is responsible for implementing LEA policies and Welsh Assembly Government legislation. Their role is similar to that of the board of directors in the world of business. The full Governing Body meets once every term. The Headteacher prepares detailed reports to be received and discussed by the governing body. These reports contain information about pupil achievements, curricular developments, staffing matters etc.

Appointment of Governors

Periodically, there are opportunities to elect parent representatives to the Governing Body. You will be informed of these vacancies as they arise.

Community Governors are co-opted by the board with a mind to ensuring that we have a broad representation of the local community and of relevant skills. If you would be interested in joining, please contact the Chair with an expression of interest. Staff Governors are elected by the staff of each school. Local Authority Governors are appointed by Carmarthenshire Council.

How do I contact the Governors?

If you have any enquiry or comment for the Board of Governors, you can write to the Chair either by email or letter to the school office. Your contribution is always welcomed. Parents' meetings will be offered as necessary to ensure that parents have the opportunity to hear about and feed into the schools' decision making. 

About the Beca / Bro Brynach School Federation

The Federation's Language Policy:

Welsh is the official language of Ysgol Beca and Ysgol Bro Brynach. Welsh is the only medium of instruction in the Foundation Phase. English is introduced into the curriculum as a subject in Year 3. In accordance with the Bilingual Policy of the Education Authority, standardized learning resources are provided to ensure that pupils are able to communicate easily both verbally and in writing in both Welsh and English by the time they leave school.

Additional Learning Needs Provision

Teachers at the school possess expertise and are committed to provide a purposeful education for all pupils including those with Additional Learning Needs. Parents who have any concerns regarding the educational, physical, emotional development or behaviour of their child are invited to discuss them with the class teacher, Head Teacher or ALNCo (Additional Learning Needs Co-ordinator).

Miss Sian Bryan is the ALNCo working across both Ysgol Beca and Ysgol Bro Brynach.

The schools welcome students from Trinity St. David's University and Coleg Sir Gâr for placements as part of their training, as well as pupils from the area's Secondary Schools on work experience.

School improvement and strategy

ESTYN Inspection

Ysgol Beca and Ysgol Bro Brynach were both visited by inspectors from ESTYN in November 2023. We were excited to be able to show the inspectors our two caring and supportive schools. We look forward to the publication of both reports, which will be available on the ESTYN website in January 2024.

Our School Development Plan (September 2023)

Priority 1: Stabilise leadership across the federation. Strengthen self-evaluation processes so that leaders at all levels act more strategically when evaluating the quality of the provision and implementing the necessary improvements.

Priority 2: Refine and embed teaching and assessment methods that have the greatest impact on pupils' learning and incorporate this good practice across the federation.

Priority 3: Strengthen the provision to support pupils to enjoy and make progress in their reading skills, especially advanced reading skills.

Priority 4: Provide a wide and progressive range of learning experiences that fully develop pupils' digital skills.

Both schools are working towards these priorities with a comprehensive strategy for monitoring, evaluation and improvement, led by the Senior Leadership Team and supported by the Local Authority and the Governors.

Following the Estyn inspection and report, we expect to revise the School Development Plan to act upon any priorities identified there for further improvement.

Curriculum and parent/guardian engagement

We aim to provide a diverse range of enjoyable and purposeful learning activities appropriate for the age and developmental stage of each child. If you would like to discuss any aspect of the school curriculum, you can do so with your child's class teacher. We hold regular parents' evenings at which you can discuss your child's progress, and open evenings when you can come to school and see your child's classroom environment and books. Both schools have social media pages with updates and photographs of school activities, where we have permission to share these If you would like to update your consent for use of photography at any time, please contact the school.

The Beca / Bro Brynach Federation

We are continuing to embed working across the Federation. Pupils have opportunities to go on trips together, visit each other's schools to use the different facilities, and to make friends who will be with them as they progress into secondary education. From the staff point of view, the Federation allows joint planning to share work and build on specific strengths. Moving to a formal Federation has been a positive experience.

Leadership

We are delighted to welcome Mr Mark Bowen as our new Headteacher of the Beca / Bro Brynach Federation in January 2024. With our thanks for her service as Acting Head, in 2024 Miss Sian Bryan will return to her post as Assistant Headteacher and Class Teacher of Year 1 and 2 at Ysgol Bro Brynach.
